
OPTION 1: HOW TO KNOW YOUR SIZE BY MEASURING A RING

VERY IMPORTANT: This document must be printed in orginal size A4.

Be sure not to use the option to fit or shrink to page, as you'll need it to be exactly the right size.

Measure the line below and make sure that's 100mm.

If you have a ring that fits the finger to be sized, place it over the circles below, matching the inside edge of the ring to the drawing If the ring falls between two sizes, choose the larger size.


Be sure not to use the option to fit or shrink to page, as you'll need it to be exactly the right size.

Measure the line below and make sure that's 100mm.

OPTION 2: IF YOU DON'T HAVE ANY RING: USE THE SIZER TO MEASURE YOUR FINGER

- 1. Cut the sizing guide below.
- 2. Wrap the sizer around the knuckle (or widest part) of the finger to be sized. Start by placing the flat end of the strip on the finger, and wrap the arrow end around until the fit is snug.
- 3. Once wrapped, the number closest to the arrow point is the ring size. There are two different papers, one with pair sizes and the other one with impairs sizes.

If in doubt, moved up to the next largest half size.
